**ACCLAIMED ARTIST SCOTT MEDLOCK**  
**LICENSED AS OFFICIAL ARTIST OF PGA TOUR**

**MOORPARK, Calif.** – The PGA TOUR and acclaimed artist Scott Medlock recently signed an agreement to make Medlock's most recent creation, "*Reflection*," an officially licensed artwork of the PGA TOUR. In conjunction with The Nicklaus Companies, the PGA TOUR and Pebble Beach Resorts, Medlock launched "*Reflection*" in May 2002.

"We are delighted to welcome Scott Medlock into the PGA TOUR's fine art licensed program," stated Leo P. McCullagh, Vice President of Retail Licensing and Consumer Marketing for the TOUR. "His talents have been acclaimed by several members of the PGA TOUR and his contributions through the world of art will continue to enhance the history of our game for years to come in a most visual sense. The PGA TOUR is proud that our licensees, such as Scott Medlock Fine Arts, reflect the same standards of quality and excellence that are synonymous with the PGA TOUR."

"My affiliation with the PGA TOUR represents an important milestone," Medlock said from his studio in Southern California. "Being that I have captured many of the greatest moments in golf history and worked with many of the game's greats throughout my career, it makes perfect sense to join forces with the PGA TOUR."

"*Reflection*," an 18" x 24" limited-edition Giclee on canvas, features golf's all-time major championship winner, Jack Nicklaus, sitting on the fence adjacent to Pebble Beach's 18<sup>th</sup> tee box at the 2000 U.S. Open, likely his last appearance in our nation's championship.

Each of the 500 limited-edition canvases sells for \$1,800 and comes accompanied by a Certificate of Authenticity, holograms, authorized signatures by Nicklaus and Medlock, and a photograph of Nicklaus and Medlock signing the work. Each of the 150 hand-embellished editions, featuring original hand-painted highlights on each canvas, signed and numbered by Medlock and Nicklaus, sells for \$2,500.

Medlock, born in Glendale, Calif., in 1968, has, in a remarkably short period of time, risen to the top of the contemporary art world. While having painted a variety of subjects from many walks of life, his fine art reproductions of golf and sports legends remain peerless for their dramatic blend of precision and passion. Medlock's mesmerizing attention to detail is matched only by his tremendous understanding of athletic movement itself, a kind of insight that frees the essence of well-known athletes in motion and lets them live forever within the frames of his work. Renowned for its impeccable craftsmanship and subtle touches of imagination, Medlock's art invites viewers to enter into the heart of athletic competition, a place where the nobility of sportsmanship meets the tireless pursuit of perfection.

"I want to capture a moment in time," Medlock says, "but I equally want to keep an element of mystery in the work so that viewers use their own imagination to complete it."

Among Medlock's many award-winning achievements, several stand out: Davis Love III with arms raised after sinking the crucial putt to win the 1993 Ryder Cup for the United States; in 1995, the family of Babe Ruth commissioned Medlock to create a work commemorating the Babe's historical farewell address to his fans in Yankee Stadium; his tribute to Ben Hogan, "Legends of Golf," is the first work of its kind to capture Nicklaus and Arnold Palmer together. Nicklaus and Palmer are pictured walking down a fairway at famed Riviera Country Club with a silhouetted image of Hogan hovering above the clubhouse in the background. This piece was used as an official poster and artwork of the 1998 U.S. Senior Open.
